Adult Foster Care Homes (Shared Living Program)

Accessible Space, Inc. (ASI) is a nonprofit organization incorporated in 1978 to provide affordable, accessible housing and twenty-four hour care services to low-income adults as an alternative to higher cost institutional care. The core of ASI's philosophy is self-reliance.

Licensed Adult Foster Care group homes (Shared Living Program) are located in the Twin Cities metro area including Blaine, Coon Rapids, White Bear Lake, St. Anthony and Falcon Heights, Minnesota. Each house is an accessible, affordable home for persons who have a brain injury or who have similar needs requiring a supportive living environment.

Staff work with residents towards increased independence in activities of daily living including physical cares, household cleaning tasks, problem solving, scheduling and tracking appointments, transportation arrangements and behavior management. Residents are invited to participate in ASI's "Was...Up? Club" to engage in activities and events, sometimes including vacations abroad!

Residents work with a Site Supervisor along with County Case Managers to identify care needs and set personal goals.

Applicants must be eligible for Minnesota's Medicaid (Medical Assistance) Program and either the Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) Waiver, or Community Alternatives for Disabled Individuals (CADI) Waiver.

Shared Living homes are subsidized by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Applicants must meet very-low income guidelines established by HUD to be eligible. Qualifying individuals pay only 30% of their adjusted gross monthly income for rent. Group Rate Housing (GRH) does not apply to the Shared Living homes so residents usually have a larger portion of their income available for discretionary spending!

The mission of Accessible Space, Inc (ASI) is to provide accessible, affordable, independent and supportive living opportunities for persons with physical disabilities and brain injuries, as well as seniors. This mission is accomplished through the development and cost-effective operation of cooperatively managed housing, supportive living and rehabilitation services.
