Independent Living Skills Service

Accessible Space, Inc. (ASI) is a nonprofit organization incorporated in 1978 to provide affordable, accessible housing and twenty - four hour care services to low-income adults as an alternative to higher cost institutional care. The core of ASI's philosophy is self-reliance.

ILS

Independent Living Skills Service (ILS) is designed to help individuals with disabilities reach their highest level of independence through personalized training. Participants live in their own homes and work with Independent Living Skills Workers.

Training through one-on-one instruction and support guides participants toward a variety of skill-building goals. This supportive guidance helps each person to achieve their highest level of independence.

Participation requires eligibility for the Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) or Community Alternatives for Disabled Individuals (CADI) Waivers, or enrollment in AXIS Healthcare. Participants may also make arrangements with ASI for private pay for services.



ILS Service may include:

- Household Management
- Personal and Health Care Management
- Problem Solving
- Interpersonal Relationships and Communication
- Nutritional Management
- Safety and Self-defense
- Time Management
- Community Orientation and Mobility
- Purposeful Activity

Specific services are arranged according to the needs of the individual.

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The mission of Accessible Space, Inc (ASI) is to provide accessible, affordable, independent and supportive living opportunities for persons with physical disabilities and brain injuries, as well as seniors. This mission is accomplished through the development and cost-effective operation of cooperatively managed housing, supportive living and rehabilitation services.
