



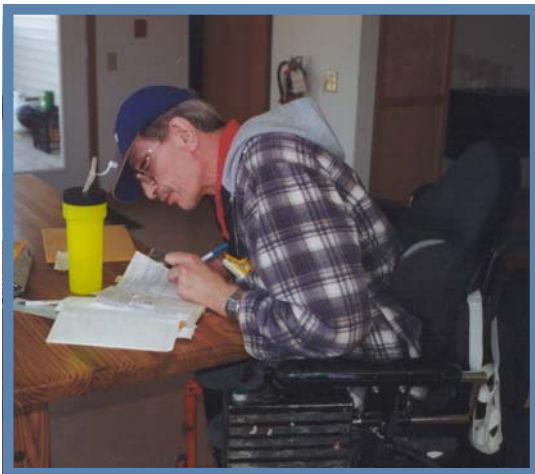

Licensed Adult Foster Care (Shared Living)

Accessible Space, Inc. (ASI) is a nonprofit organization incorporated in 1978 to provide affordable, accessible housing and twenty-four hour care services to low-income adults as an alternative to higher cost institutional care. The core of ASI's philosophy is self-reliance.

Licensed Adult Foster Care "Shared Living" group homes are located in the Twin Cities metro area. Each house is a an accessible, affordable home for persons who have a traumatic brain injury or who have similar needs requiring a supportive living environment.



Staff work with residents to increase independence in physical cares, household cleaning tasks, problem solving, scheduling appointments, transportation arrangements and behavior management.

Residents work with a Site Supervisor along with County Case Managers or AXIS Healthcare Coordinators to identify

care needs and set personal goals.

Applicants must be eligible for Minnesota's Medical Assistance Program (Medicaid) and either the Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) Waiver, Community Alternatives for Disabled Individuals (CADI) Waiver or enrollment in AXIS Healthcare.

Shared Living Homes are subsidized by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Applicants meet very-low income guidelines established by HUD to be eligible. Qualifying individuals pay only 30% of their countable monthly income for rent. Group Rate Housing does not apply to the Shared Living Homes, which
